



## RACKETIQUETTE

#### by Jonathan Perry

Since the first column I noticed a great deal of interest in my behaviour on court. Perhaps that was an indication that people had read my stuff. I'll have to practice what I preach.

Continuing from the Tennis Australia Etiquette and Rules for Non-Umpired Matches:-

- 1. If you call a ball "out", and then realise it was good, you should correct your call, and, if a point ending shot, award the point to your opponent.
- 2. In doubles, when returning service, the partner of the receiver should generally call the cross service line. The receiver should generally call the centre and side service lines.
- 3. If players cannot agree on the score, they should go back to the last score on which there was agreement and resume play from that point.
- 4. Players are prohibited from checking the mark of the ball on their opponent's side of the court, unless invited by their opponent to do so.

Here are some rule questions that have come my way:-

1. CASE - Player hits a ball over the net and it strikes his opponent on the hand and returns over the net. Is it a legal return?

DECISION - No. Rule 20 says that a player loses the point if the ball in play touches him or anything that he wears or carries, except his racket in his hand or hands.

- 2. CASE: In singles a player serves from between the tram lines. Legal?

  DECISION: No. Rule 8 (the foot fault) covers this and says that the server shall throughout the delivery of the service not touch, with either foot, any area beyond the imaginery extension of the centre mark and sideline. That means it is a foot fault to serve from outside the singles side line in singles, and from outside the doubles side line in doubles.
- 3 Who serves the start of the next set after a tie break? The person who received the first point of the tie break. Check out rule 27.
