of the Club and the projects we have in mind for the club's facilities. Although we increased Club fees to accumulate funds for these projects our financial situation for 2001-2002 remains Our membership unclear. numbers appear to have reduced slightly and some members are very tardy in paying their membership fees. This latter aspect is disappointing as it makes the job of the committee (another volunteer group) unnecessarily more difficult. If you are one of those that has not paid your fees please do so as a matter of priority.

We continue to look at ways of improving the club facilities but we must tailor our spending to match our resources. Our priority is to maintain the playing surfaces of the club in top order, hence the refurbishment of courts 11 and 12 will have first call on any excess funds we may have. We are also planning to provide further shade structures around the club (between courts 2 and 3) as part of our funding obligations from Sunsmart. We hope to add further shade structures in other areas as our finances permit.

Our Social subcommittee has two important fund raising social events planned over the next 4 months (Dinner Dance, and Quiz Night). These are important events not just for raising funds but also provide a good opportunity for members to meet

and mix in an environment away from the sweat and liniment. You are encouraged to make up a table and bring some friends to what promises to be very good night.

The advent of the new club BBQ's also provide an excellent opportunity for members to enjoy the club facilities. During the warm weather we plan to hold a BBQ after Saturday social tennis every first Saturday of the month. Stay a while, enjoy the food, wine and excellent views on the balmy evenings.

Club security remains a worry. Over the last few months we have experienced a raft of thefts culminating in two breakins. This is a worrying trend. One solution would be to keep our facilities under lock and key all the time but this would rob members of the access to the facilities they currently enjoy. Although this may become



necessary we hope that we can solve the problem by being more vigilant by all members taking part in a Club Watch initiative. This is a simple process and only requires each member to be more watchful and take a moment to ensure that no-one unknown or suspicious is left unchallenged about the grounds. Another simple step is to appoint someone in any playing group as responsible for ensuring any moveable items (such as chairs) are put away and if no-one is using the Clubhouse it is closed up. Libby will discuss these measures with the regular club users in the weeks to come.

The Dalkeith Bridge Club continues to seek an area on the David Cruickshank reserve to build its new facilities. Unfortunately they have chosen a site near courts 26-28 that

The committee will be strenuously resisting the Bridge Club proposal. As the Council will be seeking community opinion on the Bridge Club proposal all members of the Tennis Club are encouraged to lodge their displeasure with the Council.

The committee is evaluating the feasibility of providing a different playing surface at the club. This is a long term plan aimed at the vacant area between the clubhouse and the bowling club courts. Recently some members have tried a new, very low maintenance, artificial clay surface. This surface does not require watering, needs minimal sweeping and offers a very reliable, medium height bounce. Importantly the surface is not 'hard' and is more akin to playing on grass for those of us (myself included) that prefer something that is not too harsh on aging joints. As these courts will be quite expensive we will need to employ innovative ways of fund raising if we are to proceed. Clearly such an investment will need wide consultation with the membership.

Finally I would like to recognise the excellent performance of Casey Dellacqua who plays No. 1 for DTC's Ladies State League.

WHAT'S HAPPENING MIDWEEK?


This season we have seven day and two night pennant teams. Most of these teams look like qualifying for the finals which is a great effort by all concerned.


Special mention to Meredith Wilkinson and Paulien de Boer, both of whom had excellent first-half performances.

MIDWEEK POLICY & GUIDELINES

Policy & Guidelines for Ladles Midweek Pennant Team Selection.

Club policy is based on Tennis West requirements and principles of treating every player objectively and fairly. Provided guidalines have been followed, the Pennant Team Selection Committee selections will be final, subject to final ratification by Tennis West.

il. Temis West Requirements

Tennis West requires Glubs to submit with team nominations a current Glub renked list of players each season, showing all entrants including reserves in "strict order of playing ability." Tennis West that the power to accept or decline any Team or Member of a Team so submitted, allot the Team or any Member of a Team so submitted, allot the Team or any Member of and inay at its discretion alter the ranking of any Team Member thire the season."

The ranked list is checked by Trainis West against each player's periformance percentages in the previous comparable season (i.e. summer entries are compared with the previous summer season's percentages, not with winter season's). Terms West will challenge the position of any player whose ranked position does not appear to be supported by Trainis West's own statistics. These statistics are provided to the Club, before the start of each season for their use in team selections.

If challenged, the Club invertibe able to justify a person's ranked position on the basis of information not available to Tennis West such as results in the Club Championships or change of ranking through injury, absence or any other personal reson.

Subject to the above, team salection is the responsibility of the Club Midweek Selection Committee, who will suggest divisions for the teams submitted. Terms West alone will allocate team divisions.

2. Club Maweek Selection Committee

The selection committee shall comprise:

- ் The Wice-Captain (Lady Captain))
- o The Midweak Pennant Team Coordinator
- Elected Representative from each of the teams entered in the previous season's pennent composition.

The Midweek Pennant Selection Committee will cleat a Chamman who will preside over the selection process.

The Club Capitally may be requested to adjudicate on contentious issues or conflicts of interest, and ensure that objectivity is maintained.

The Coordinator will have input into team selection. The Midweek Coordinator will distribute, collect and collete player nominations ready for team selection meetings.
