FROM THE CLUB CAPTAIN

Player Ratings

Player ratings are currently being reviewed by the Ratings Committee and it is expected that new ratings will be issued by the time of publication of this edition of the Whisper. The committee is concerned at shortcomings in the ratings process and is determined to put in place mechanisms which make the ratings reviews more inclusive, objective, transparent and consistent.

The primary basis for reviews has been performances in tournaments and competitions. While this may be sufficient for players who play regular competition, it does not include those who play competitive tennis infrequently, if at all. It should be borne in mind that one of the main objectives of rating players is to ensure good sets during organised social play. In addition there are problems with the low frequency of reviews (once per year may be inadequate) and the rating of new members. The committee has also observed "bracket creep" where ratings are inflated over time because of the inexorable tendency to increase - ratings always go up and never down! This devalues the system.

The Ratings Committee will be reviewing all realistic options to improve the current system and will keep members advised in future editions of the Whisper.

Saturday Social Play

I have received several helpful suggestions regarding improvements to the system of set selection during social tennis. The main suggestions may be summarised as follows:

- The spread of player ratings in sets is too wide or too narrow.
- Playing too often with the same players and not enough with others.
- Sets organisers should use their judgement more.
- Sets organisers should not interfere with the computer.

To some degree, all of the above are valid suggestions, however it does highlight the difficulties of satisfying everyone. I believe the main problem is due to lack of variety in the way in which sets are organised. Over the next few months, we will be trying a few ideas to improved variety in social tennis without sacrificing quality such as computer free days, modifying the allowable ratings spread in the computer and investigating systems used by other clubs. Constructive feedback on the success of these initiatives will be welcome.

Latest happenings at 101 Stirling Hwy

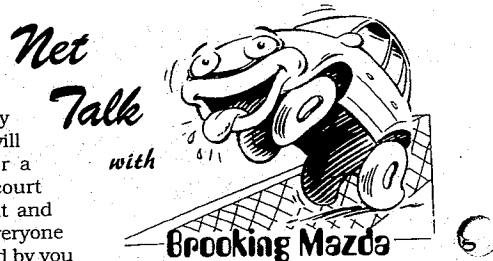

RACKETIQUETTE

MORE ETIQUETTE TIPS

- All balls on your side of the net are your responsibility to pick up and, where appropriate, return directly to the server.
- The receiver should not return the first service if it is an obvious fault. Let it go by or ground it.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators, including parents, coaches etc, in making line calls, or attempting to determine on-court matters.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the game score before starting a game and the point score prior to serving for each point.
- **WAIT UNTIL A POINT IS OVER BEFORE WALKING BEHIND A COURT WHERE PLAY IS IN PROGRESS.** Which leads directly to the next point.....
- To retrieve a ball from another court or to return a ball to another court, **WAIT** until the players have completed a point. I am amazed at how many mature members thoughtlessly offend this principle. The result is you disrupt the other game due to your own impatience. Have a care for other tennis players. If the older members don't do the right thing then how can you expect the younger ones to.
- This is a repeat from two issues ago. Players are responsible for all calls on their side of the net. **IF IN DOUBT, GIVE THE OPPONENT THE BENEFIT OF THE DOUBT AND PLAY THE BALL AS IN.** It is **BAD PRACTICE** to play two if there is doubt. That just says the caller did not have the guts to admit a bad call was made. If you make a bad call, admit it and the right thing to do is to acknowledge you have made a hindrance and offer the opponents the point. If you are sure of your call, then it is wrong to allow the opponents to pressure you into altering your call.

"NO-LET" ON TEST

Just in from the International Tennis Federation. An experimental abolition of the "let" rule in service will be recommended to the ITF Annual General Meeting in Lausanne next month following discussion at the recent Committee of Management meeting in Barcelona.

In its continuing effort to find ways to improve the game, the ITF will recommend abolition of the let serve for all matches at the Davis Cup Zonal Group III and IV ties, starting in 1997, on a two year trial basis.

If the trial is successful the ITF will then consult with other interested parties in the game (read ATP).


